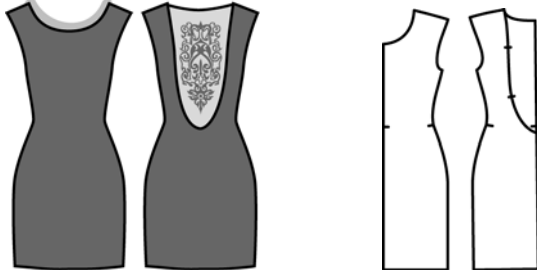


Inspiration No. 50 - Anniversary Special



5005 Cocktail dress

Sizes 34 - 40



Materials

- * 1.1m stretch velvet, 140cm wide
- * 0.3m fabric netting
- * Bondaweb or Steam-a-Seam
- * Solufleece (water-soluble stabiliser) and Cut Away stabiliser
- * BERNINA embroidery computer, e.g. BERNINA 830 with Jumbo Hoop
- * BERNINA overlocker
- * BERNINA CutWork
- * Quilting and CutWork foot no. 44

Print out pattern; for 'Page size adjustment', select 'None'. Please note the test square on page 2 of the PDF. Glue pages together.

Note

This pattern is suitable for highly elastic material only!

Cutting out

- 1 x front to fabric fold
- 1 x back to fabric fold
- 1 x back insert to fabric fold from the fabric netting (cut out after embroidering)
- Neckline facing for the front approx. 45cm, finished width 1.5cm.

Instructions

1. Use file ASC 00080.cmx in the CutWork Samples folder as a template. We rotated the design by 180° and enlarged it to 360 x 165mm, which fits easily into the Jumbo Hoop. Duplicate line twice. Set bottom-most line with CutWork and set off by 1.2. Use the second level for staystitching on the fabric netting, and the third level for sewing on the sections with the cut-out parts. We used a 2mm-wide, 1.7mm-long zigzag stitch, offset -0.4. Transfer file to sewing computer.
2. Using no steam, press Bondaweb to the back of a piece of velvet. Do not tear away paper. Place velvet together with ironed-on Bondaweb on the hooped Cut Away and have the BERNINA 830 embroider an outline of the design to hold it in place. Cut out the design with the CutWork Tool (colours 1-4).
3. Hoop fabric netting between Solufleece and staystitch the design. Pull paper away from the CutWork pieces, place pieces on staystitched Solufleece, matching

them accurately to the markings, and iron on carefully in the hoop. Embroider the last colour.

4. Hem one long side of the netting strip with the rolled hem of the overlocker. Sew to front of neckline. Cut back netting to size plus seam allowance. Hem top edge with the rolled hem. Sew this section into the back. Close shoulder seams. Hem armhole. Close side seams. Hem dress.
